What got you interested in wireless?

Back in early 2000 a good friend and co-worker, Mike Batterden, called me up all excited to tell me that I needed to rush out and pick up the latest Linksys 802.11b USB client and a matching wireless router because this was going to be the next big thing in computing. I immediately rushed out to BestBuy and grabbed what I needed and I have never looked back. I also had a substantial amount of RF training while in the military and loved the idea of wireless communications.
